

Bromham Road Bridge

Bromham Road Bridge lies in the centre of Bedford to the north of Bedford railway station. The bridge needs to be raised to make space for new overhead power lines as part of our electrification of the railway north of Bedford.

Midland Main Line Upgrade

To help meet rising demand the Midland Main Line is undergoing the largest upgrade since it was completed in 1870. Upgrades include track realignment, station remodelling, construction of a fourth line between Bedford and Kettering and the electrification of the line northwards to Wellingborough, Kettering and Corby.

Electrifying the railway enables modern bi-mode trains to operate on our network that are both quieter and cleaner than diesel, benefitting passengers and people living close to the railway.

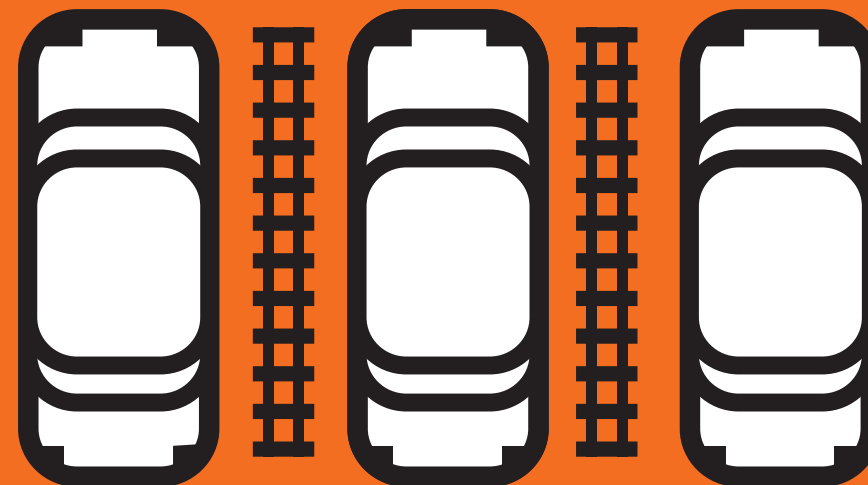

Temporary changes to car parking at Bedford Station



From 6 October, for up to 11 weeks, we will be placing a crane in Bedford Station Car Park to support the reconstruction at Bromham Road Bridge.

This means there will be a significant reduction in parking from **21 October**.
